"VISIONS OF EIGHT" WELL WORTH SEEING.

It's not very often that a film comes around having anything to do with track and field. That in itself makes "Visions of Eight" unique. Beyond that, however, if you're a human being with any feeling whatsoever you'll enjoy this remarkable view of the 1972 Munich Olympics. Eight of the most outstanding movie directors in the world got together on this one, each probing into the essence of a different aspect of the Olympics. This is no ordinary chronicle of results! It is an artistic, aesthetic experience to be enjoyed by all.

Yes, I said all can enjoy it. Particularly interesting should be the 8th segment, "The Longest" featuring favored Ron Hill of England in the Marathon. I found the most inspiring part to be "The Beginning."

The other six sections were titled, "The Strongest", "The Highest", "The Women", "The Losers", "The Fastest", and "The Decathlon."

I suppose that since this is a highly worthwhile film, clean, wholesome and fantastic, that it will make a very short run in an area. I strongly urge you to get out and see this movie as soon as possible--regardless of cost. I'll stake my critic's reputation on the fact that you will be thoroughly delighted, inspired, entertained and moved by this incredibly fine film.

Phila., Pa., Sunday, November 25, 1973 Noon- Bill Bragg, a 24-year-old New Jersey artist captured first place in the 4th annual Philadelphia Marathon sponsored by the Penn AC on the East & West River Drive course in Fairmount Park. Bragg, who trains more than 100 miles a week, covered the flat course on the warm, rainy afternoon in 2:29:44.4 to win by seven minutes over Joe Witowski (2:36:42) of the Central Jersey TC. Entries in this year's race were over 50 more than last year, and a giant step from the 40 who entered Penn AC's first marathon four years ago.

**IRISHMAN WINS SPRINGBANK '12'**

Sept. 23, 1973- At 138 pounds, Neil Cusack, in his own words, is "as light as a feather".

The slight 21-year-old Irishman tickled the fancy of the crowd of 3,000 gathered at the sixth annual Springbank International road races by winning the men's open 12 miles in a star-studded field which included five 1972 Olympians and the first and second-place finishers in this year's Boston Marathon.

Running his first big race since coming off a hip injury last spring, Cusack blasted home in frost on the final lap to win in 56:11.

The record, set in 1971 over a slightly less demanding course, is 55:33.8 by Ken Moore of the Oregon TC who finished third this year behind Cusack and Jon Anderson of the Oregon TC, winner of the 1973 Boston Marathon.

The course, altered this year, is actually shorter than previously, but is considered tougher with the addition of another hill.

Cusack, who was brought up in Limerick City in Southern Ireland not far from where the legendary Tim Smythe held forth as a runner, attends East Tennessee University where he is a senior.

"I felt fairly relaxed for the first six miles. But the last lap was hard. I had to run hard because I was afraid of who was behind me. I knew that Anderson was close," he said in his soft brogue.

Anderson along with Moore, Jeff Galloway, Tom Fleming, Steve Savage and Philip Ndoe of Kenya and Eastern New Mexico University were with Cusack for the first six miles but then the Irishman got a little weary of the pace which many felt was stiff.

"Going into the third lap, I decided to push it" he explained. He finished a good 50y in front of Anderson and appeared strong at the finish line despite the stepped up pace.

Cusack, Anderson, Moore, Fleming & Galloway were all timed at 13:47 for three miles. At the six-mile mark, Cusack, Moore, Anderson and Fleming were clocked in the same time, 27:54.

"I like six miles best but any race three miles and over is my race," said Cusack who represented Ireland in the 1972 Olympics where he failed to get out of the heats in the 10,000 meters.

At 19 years of age, he set a world junior record of 2 hours and 16 minutes and recently set a European indoor three-mile record of 13:10.0.

Defending champion in the 12 miles Frank Shorter of the Florida TC didn't compete due to his foot injury.

Dan Shaughnessy continued on his bright comeback trail as he won the four and a half mile run with a driving finish which overtook Ken Miener of the Florida TC. Shaughnessy, a former Ontario high school champion from Banting Memorial in Alliston, was clocked in 19:59.4 which failed to beat Frank Shorter's record of 19:52.8 set in 1970.

Saughnessy, who won both the 5,000 and 10,000m in the recent Canadian championships at Vancouver and who was second in the 10,000 at a Pan-Pacific Conference Satellite meet this past summer, said the pace was "fast".

Francie Larrivee, a 5'4", 105 lb. student at Florida State University running under the colors of the San Jose Cindergale of California, won the ladies open four and a half miles, the first time the event has been run at Springbank. She clocked 24:09.2.

Ron Wallingford, a physical education professor at Laurentian University in Sudbury, Ontario, who turned 40 just 10 days ago, won the over 40 six miles. Temp. low 60s, mild winds.

VIC NELSON WINS MARYLAND MARATHON

Baltimore, Md., Sat., Nov. 24, 1973 - Vic Nelson, a 24-year-old Naval officer, captured the first Maryland Marathon in 2:22:56.6.

Nelson, representing the Baltimore Olympic Club, led from start to finish, building up margins of up to three-quarters of a mile on the field. At the finish, he had 500 yards on a fast-closing Martins Ande, of Nigeria.

Ed Herford, of the North Carolina TC, was third, followed by Mike Sabino, Baltimore OC, and Till Luftt, of West Germany. There were 461 entries and 434 starters. The first 67 runners broke three hours, while there were still some stragglers making it across the finish line at the end of six hours.

The Baltimore Olympic Club won the team title with 12 points to 15 for the Washington Sports Club. Sabino, James Harrison, 27th in 2:44:42, and Nelson gave the team a 1-2-3 finish among team runners. WSC had a 3-4-8 finish with Phil Stewart, Ray Morrison and Robt. Harper.

Nelson, a University of Kentucky graduate, has been stationed at Bainbridge the last 2 & 1/2 years and has run several races in the area, although much of the course was unfamiliar to him.

"I had run in the Loch Raven area before, so I was determined to get out as fast as I could. I was just trying to keep up the pace. I had heard rumors of how tough Satyr Hill was and I figured it couldn't be that bad—but it was. I had to have some lead in case I falter ed there."

For Nelson, it was his third triumph in as many marathon starts.

Ande, a 24-year-old Occidental College graduate, who flew in Friday night from his home in Albuquerque, was upset with himself for not sticking closer to Nelson in the early going.

Ande had run second in the 37-mile ultra-marathon in Washington a month ago, and finished the 53-mile London-to-Brighton race in late September.

Sabino was pleased with his effort, the first sub-2:30 of his life in his seventh marathon, but was somewhat disgusted for yielding third to Hereford in the last half-mile. The 34-year-old Howard County elementary school teacher competed in the Berwick (Pa.) 9.3-mile race on Thanksgiving Day and finished second.

Lufft, winner of the Atlantic City Marathon last month, was second at the turnaround point, but caught a stitch in his side coming back & slowed to a walk several times. His return trip was more than eight minutes slower than his out-going time.

Kathy Switzer, the 26-year-old New York marathoner, was more proud of her 103rd place in the fastest time of her life (5:10:37), than she was in being the first woman to finish. "As long as there are going to be classifications, I'm glad to be first, but what I'd really like is to win one of these bloody things."

The competitors were lavish in their praise for such a well-organized and conducted race in a first-time effort. . . The city and county police departments and the Dept. of Traffic and Transit did a remarkable job of keeping the course clear and handling the massive traffic problems which resulted in certain places.

John Wall, 65, the first Master to finish, had the third fastest time ever for 65 & over. 3:01:37. DeWitt Paul earned the Walter Korpman Memorial award for the first 40-49 finisher. 37th in 2:49:45. University of Maryland sophomore Thomas Jireou, from Kensington, Md., was the first teen-ager to finish. 17th in 2:39:57

Winner Nelson stated, "I think I'm going to get out of marathons for awhile." The 4:07 miser added, "I've got plenty of time for marathons but not for track. I'm going to run indoors and begin training for the 1976 Olympics." Nelson received the Governor's Cup, which was presented by Mayor William Donald Schaefer. The state and city sponsored the event.

For those who doubted the least Villanova mile great could go that fast in Oregon, he ran a 2:18.2 a week later.

**Start or Not?**  
In cross country, Hartnett excelled at the European junior championships in 1970 for what he called "my greatest win." But the IC4A mile always eluded him. He was second as a freshman, fifth as a sophomore and third as a junior.

## SAUVIE'S ISLAND MARATHON WON BY JOE SKAJA

Portland, Oregon, Sat., Nov. 24, 1973. Joe Skaja of Portland took the lead at the 20-mile mark & went on to win the second annual Sauvie Island Marathon Saturday afternoon on the north Portland island.

Skaja ran the 26 miles & 385y in 2:22:07.2. He broke the course record set by Jim Pearson last year by over three minutes.

Wolfgang Schamberger, Vancouver, B.C., set the early pace, led through the first 20 miles, then fell to second behind Skaja.

Marilyn Paul of Portland won the women's division in 3:05:41. She beat second place finisher Debbie Collins, Delta, B.C., by almost 15 minutes.

Some 276 stout-hearted, scantily clad souls ran for cardboard plaques and days of fatigue as evidence of their fortitude.

Fifteen women were among them.

Pony-tailed Debbie Koffel, a 9-year-old from Hillsboro, kept pace with full-grown men whose legs were twice as long. And Catherine Smith--the oldest female entry, at age 40--was hot on the heels of husband Ross, a nationally known veteran marathon runner.

Running, once such a solitary sport, has in recent years become a new opportunity for commiseration and comradeship. So, heeding society's emphasis on physical fitness and weight control, women seem to be jumping into jogging suits almost as fast as men.

What better way to keep in shape, since running is one of the few ways to exercise without spending a fortune on equipment (head skis, anyone?) or half the day looking for a partner ("Sorry, I'm booked. And I don't know how to play tennis, anyway.")

Oregon even has the ideal climate for running, according to members of the Oregon Road Runners Club, whose aim it is to promote running in the Northwest. Wind-lashed or water-splashed, its members have learned to laugh at the rain.

Marilyn Paul, the first woman finisher, explained, she and husband Norm first donned sweatshirts and running shoes to condition themselves for mountain climbing. But the pair liked marathon running so well, they've never had time to climb any mountains.

The race was strictly downhill for Marilyn. The 35-year-old runner's 3:05:41 shaved more than 30 minutes off the current women's world record for her age group.

A break in the Santa Ana weather drew an unexpectedly large field and set up a remarkable individual record-setting spree in what was probably the first 50-mile track race ever held in Southern California. Twenty-two runners, ranging in age from 11 to 67, started out to cover 200 laps of SMC's dirt track at approximately 3:20pm. Nearly nine-and-one-half hours later, the last of eight finishers crossed the line.

Eventual winner Carlos Alfaro went out at a suicidal pace (5:17 mile, 59:56 10mi) behind Pete Mundle, whose declared intention was only to establish over-40 track marks at 15 and 20km (54:01, 72:04). Alfaro continued to run fairly strongly past 20mi. With 16mi remaining, however, he appeared finished as Dave Russell rapidly made up a 2 1/2-lap deficit and smoothly cruised into a four-minute lead--only to be suddenly stopped dead by severe leg cramps in his 39th mile. Suffering himself from fatigue and cramps, Alfaro gamely held on over the final 15mi to win his first SPA Championship by a good margin over steady-pacing Bill McCray and fast-closing Tom Cory.

During the same critical stages, the BIG (and much less grim) story of the race took a subtle and increasingly exciting turn. For 25mi, Eileen Waters of San Diego, the lone woman entrant, had been content with a 9min/mi pace as she cheerfully pursued Natalie Cullimore's best-ever (road) mark of 7:26:40. (Last year, on the same road course, Ms. Waters recorded 8:10.) Smiling, giggling, exchanging witticisms with onlookers, and singing along with songs from the transistor radio clutched in her right hand, she gradually began to push the pace. After a "pit stop" knocked her 31st mile up to 9:41, she scooted the next four laps in 7:46--and really started to roll. After another forced stop in the 39th mile (9:16), she shifted gears once more and--still smiling--smoked the final 10mi in 75:54 to set up a women's world record of 7:05:31. Enroute, she also established a dozen other American and world records at standard distances from 20km on. Over the closing 15mi, she ran nearly seven minutes faster than any other finisher; and her final mile of 6:46 also topped the field. "A marvelous experience," she signed afterwards--showing absolutely no outward signs of distress--"I've found my race." (Ms. Waters has run the mile a few seconds under 6 min and the marathon in 3:16.)
